**Lower Bucks County Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors  
Adopts Three Pro-Business Resolutions**

Recently, the Board of Directors, for the Lower Bucks County Chamber of Commerce adopted three resolutions that reflect their pro-business advocacy. The resolutions address issues that are looming at both the federal and the state levels of government.

“Our chamber is the voice of business.”, said Brandon McFadden, Chairman of the Board of Directors for the chamber. “These resolutions reflect the will of our members. Our advocacy on these issues will improve the business climate in our county.” he added.

The first resolution addresses the US Congress and encourages legislation that will establish sustainable limits for forage fish. Without limits, forage fish, such as river shad, could be endangered. Shad is a significant species to the Delaware River and many local businesses participate and benefit from the annual Shad Fest that is held.

The second resolution supports the PA State House bill HB 18. This addresses the lack of a formulary for prescription drugs in the PA Workers Compensation Law. Without a formulary, drugs costs continue to skyrocket, and prescription abuse and dependence increases. The adoption of HB 18 would bring the Workers Compensation Law in alliance with many of the employer provided health care plans.

The third resolution addresses the issue of gerrymandering in the legislative and congressional redistricting process. The chamber believes that districts that are unfairly drawn will have an adverse impact on business operations. Additionally, the chambers believe businesses in like areas may not be fairly represented. The chamber calls on the PA Legislature to revise the current PA process to resolve these inequities.

“Next year (2018) will be 60th anniversary year in representing businesses in Bucks County. We continue to strive to be the voice of business and to represent our members on the important issues that are facing the business community.” said McFadden.
